KASPER

KASPER is Kentucky's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP). KASPER tracks Schedule II – V controlled substance prescriptions dispensed within the state as reported by pharmacies and other dispensers.

- Over 10.8 million controlled substance prescriptions dispensed in Kentucky in 2017
- Over 8.5 million requests for KASPER data in 2017

Kentucky Drug Courts Key Components

1. DRUG COURTS INTEGRATE ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG TREATMENT SERVICES WITH JUSTICE SYSTEM CASE PROCESSING.
2. USING A NONADVERSARIAL APPROACH, PROSECUTION AND DEFENSE COUNSEL PROMOTE PUBLIC SAFETY WHILE PROTECTING PARTICIPANTS' DUE PROCESS RIGHTS.
3. ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS ARE IDENTIFIED EARLY AND PROMPTLY PLACED IN THE DRUG COURT PROGRAM.
4. DRUG COURTS PROVIDE A CONTINUUM OF ALCOHOL, DRUG, AND OTHER TREATMENT AND REHABILITATIVE SERVICES.
5. ABSTINENCE IS MONITORED BY FREQUENT ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG TESTING.

Kentucky Drug Courts Key Components

6. A COORDINATED STRATEGY GOVERNS DRUG COURT RESPONSES TO PARTICIPANTS' COMPLIANCE.
7. ONGOING JUDICIAL INTERACTION WITH EACH DRUG COURT PARTICIPANT IS ESSENTIAL.
8. MONITORING AND EVALUATION MEASURE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF PROGRAM GOALS AND GAUGE EFFECTIVENESS.
9. CONTINUING INTERDISCIPLINARY EDUCATION PROMOTES EFFECTIVE DRUG COURT PLANNING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND OPERATIONS.
10. FORGING PARTNERSHIPS AMONG DRUG COURTS, PUBLIC AGENCIES, AND COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS GENERATES LOCAL SUPPORT AND ENHANCES DRUG COURT PROGRAM EFFECTIVENESS.


Kentucky Drug Court: Saving Costs, Saving Lives

Since the Kentucky Court of Justice began implementing Drug Court in 1996, thousands of participants have successfully completed the program. Instead of spending time in jail, eligible participants complete a substance abuse program supervised by a judge. Because of the focus on rehabilitation, Drug Court graduates are more likely to return to productive lives by staying gainfully employed, paying child support and meeting other obligations.

KASPER Statute - KRS 218A.202

The Cabinet for Health and Family Services shall be authorized to provide data to:

A **judge** or a probation or parole officer administering a diversion or probation program of a criminal defendant arising out of a violation of this chapter or of a criminal defendant who is documented by the court as a substance abuser who is eligible to participate in a court-ordered drug diversion or probation program;

ACME * – The Active Cumulative Morphine Equivalent is calculated using a conversion formula from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC). The calculation is based on the daily Morphine Equivalent Dose (MED) prescribed to the patient as of the last day in the date range requested for your report query (the 'To Date'). The prescriptions used to calculate the ACME presented on this report are highlighted by bold text. The ACME is calculated based on prescription data reported to KASPER only and does not include prescription data from other states.

Daily MED * – The Morphine Equivalent Dose is a measure that equates different opioid potencies (based on route and dose) to a standard morphine equivalent. The Daily MED indicates the morphine equivalent value assigned to the daily dose for each individual prescription record.
