Must be employed by the facility, apply for an account and then be linked by a Master Account holder also employed in the facility providing the Delegate authority to query patients on their behalf.
Criteria for Dispenser delegates to get account:
Must be employed by the facility, apply for an account and then be linked by a Master Account holder also employed in the facility providing the Delegate authority to query patients on their behalf.
Criteria for PAs to get account:
Physician Assts must be a licensed NH practitioner and have a DEA # that allows them to prescribe and/or dispense controls in the State of NH.
Criteria for Nurse Practitioners to get account:
APRN must be a licensed NH practitioner and have a DEA # that allows them to prescribe and/or dispense controls in the State of NH.
Criteria for other users to get account:
Dentists, Podiatrists, Optometrists, Veterinarians, Physicians and Naturopaths must be licensed NH practitioners and have a DEA # that allows them to prescribe and/or dispense control substances in the State of NH.

Enrollment Mandate Criteria: All veterinarians with a NH license and a DEA # associated with their NH

license are required to register with the NH PDMP. This is different than registering as a dispenser, which is a different registration that allows

them to upload all dispensations
