



#### Unintentional and Undetermined Opioid Deaths per 100,000 Population, Ageadjusted Rates, Utah and U.S., 1999-2017




# Age-adjusted Rate of Deaths per 100,000 Population by Injury Type, Utah 1999-2017






# Rate of Drug Poisoning Deaths per 100,000 Population, Utah 1999-2015




#### Number of drug poisoning deaths by manner of death, Utah, 2000-2015






# Utah Opioid Crisis Response Blueprint

Published on January 31, 2022, serves as a **roadmap for utilizing opioid settlement funds** in the state. Aimed at maximizing the benefits of settlement spending to alleviate opioid-related harms in Utah.

#### RECOMMENDED STRATEGIES: SUBJECT MATTER EXPERTS (SMEs)



**Evidence-based and data-driven** strategies should be prioritized.

**Results and outcomes** should be tracked and reported.



# Utah Opioid Task Force

A voluntary group that includes representation from agencies and organizations across the state. As subject matter experts, their mission includes acting against opioid abuse through law enforcement, prosecution, legislation, and innovation. The Opioid Settlement Task Force (UTOTF) is part of this group












The Utah Senate passed sections of the Utah Code urging health insurers to minimize opioid addiction and overdose deaths. Policies include non-narcotic treatment alternatives for chronic pain and medication-assisted treatment for opioid dependence disorders.



**2007** – Established Use Only As Directed to reduce deaths and other harm from prescription opiates **2010** – Prescribers of Controlled substances must register to use the Utah controlled Substance Database (PDMP), take tutorial, and pass test **2011** – Law requiring prescribers with CS license to take 4 hours of CS classes each licensing period 2013 – Law requires certain CS prescribers to complete 4 hours of CE for renewal and 3.5 must be CS prescribing





**2014** – Good Samaritan Law and Naloxone Law. Good Samaritan enables bystanders to report an overdose w/o fear of prosecution. Naloxone permits prescribers to prescribe naloxone to 3<sup>rd</sup> parties and administer it.


**2016** – Utah's' statewide standing order for naloxone

2018 – Checking the CSD

**2020** - Enacts a health program for health care professionals to provide an alternative to public disciplinary action for licensees who have substance use disorders.





- Limiting opioid prescriptions for acute, non-complex, non-chronic conditions to seven days (2017 HB 50, Ward)
- Requiring prescribers to check the prescription drug monitoring program data prior to issuing a first opioid prescription unless it is only for three days or less or for a 30-day post-surgery supply (2017 HB 50, Ward)
- Screening, brief intervention, and referral to treatment training and provider reimbursement for services (2017 HB 175 Eliason)
- Adoption of opioid risk-reduction policies, such as clinical guidelines on prescribing opioids by insurers (2017 HB 90, Ward).
- Establishing a process for court-ordered essential treatment and intervention for individuals suffering from a substance use disorder (2017 HB 286, Christensen).
- Establishing co-prescribing guidelines for naloxone (2017 SB 258, Mayne).










A public awareness campaign on the risk of opioid, overdose indicators, the use of naloxone, and the safe use, storage and disposal of narcotic drugs.

#### Naloxone Distribution via UDOH Efforts



#### **Overdose Outreach Pilot Program**

- > 1,599 purchased / 757 distributed / 617 individuals
  - 6 local health departments (50%)
  - 9 direct service agencies (44%)
  - 17 law enforcement agencies (6%)

#### **Community-level Grantees**

- > 512 naloxone kits disseminated
  - 5 local health departments
  - 3 local substance abuse authorities

#### **Emergency Provisions**

- 180 naloxone kits disseminated
  - Law enforcement agencies

#### Standing Order (Dec 8-Dec 31)

- > 17% of Utah pharmacies distributed 140 kits
- ➤ Current enrollment: 21% of pharmacies



#### Campaigns



<u>Use Only As Directed</u> **2007**(changed to 'Know Your Script'):

- Educating public about how to use prescription pain medications safely
- Launched statewide provider education (CME credits)

#### **Stop the Opidemic Campaign (2017):**

- Raise awareness on opioid abuse and misuse while reducing stigma.
- Information and resources to opioids prescribers in Utah
- Billboards have been placed along the Wasatch Front, US 6, and in Carbon County.



#### Access to Treatment

#### **Opioid Treatment Programs and Initiatives**

- Fifteen opioid treatment programs (OTP's) in Utah provide medication-assisted treatment (MAT) for persons diagnosed with opioid-use disorder.
- Serve 3495 individuals a year.
- Opioid Community Collaborative: IHC, Davis and Weber County
- Interdisciplinary approach.
- Project targets Pregnant women, women between 20-35 and individuals who are homeless.
- Salt Lake County Extended Release Naltrexone Pilot
- Salt Lake County, Midtown health Clinic, Utah Department of Corrections
- One of the largest jail MAT programs in Country (248 Participants).
- First shot administered within County jail



#### Access to Treatment

#### **Utah Opioid State Targeted Response Grant**

- Utah Received \$5.5 million
- Completed required needs assessment and developed a strategic plan
- Funding provided to high need communities
- Continuum of evidence-based prevention, treatment, and recovery services for unfunded, underserved youth (age 12-17) and adults (18+) at risk, or with an opioid use disorder.
- Project goals are to:
  - prevent/ reduce opioid misuse, reduce overdose deaths,
  - expand access to evidence-based treatment,
  - increase partnerships with physical health and promote recovery.








### Opioid prescriptions dispensed per 100 population, Utah 2006-2016








#### Academic Detailing/Public Health Consulting

The Division of Professional Licensing Program oversees academic detailing to educate healthcare providers on the appropriate use of opioids.






#### Average searches 3 months after consultation (ORR)



## Comparing 3 & 6 Month Visits for 25 Providers





#### Search Activity over 6 months (ORR)




